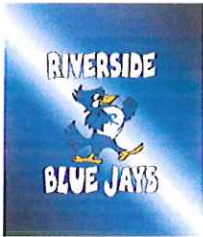

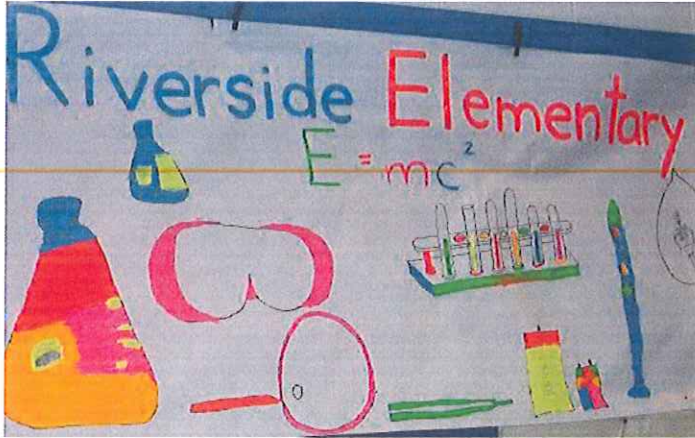
## TRACK & FIELD DAYS
